
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AMP in the Community



How Immigrant Generation and Mentors **Shape Educational Success**



Although many immigrant-origin students are optimistic and have aspirations for the future, they still experience challenges (e.g., xenophobia, racism, and discrimination) often associated with psychological distress, lower self-esteem, depressive feelings, lower school grades, and more school absences. However, despite the potential mentoring relationships have in addressing these issues and promoting social capital, mentoring engagement can differ for adolescents based on their backgrounds.


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Supporting Youth with Disabilities through Mentorship
